Project Summary:

The project investigated the conditions of setting up public social security systems in rural China, with an emphasis on old-age pensions and health services. The study on health services was conducted by Prof. Liu while Prof. Leisering conducted the study of pensions and also led the overall research team.

The study of old-age pensions aimed to depict the current provisions for old age in China and the earlier development since the fifties; to provide a conceptual framework for analysing oldage security in rural areas; to look at the experiences of other countries in the field of rural pensions; and to investigate the key issues of the current reform debate: the viability of family support and land as pillars of rural old-age security; the effectiveness of the pilot pension schemes in selected areas; and the problems of inequality and the environment of pension policies.

The study of pensions included field visits in three types of counties: two well-off counties in Shandong Province, a poor county in Yunnan Province and a middle county in Hubei. On the basis of the evidence from the field visits the project drafted policy options and strategies.
